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Outlined by well-defined topographical boundaries, San Lorenzo lodges, in an area covered on foot in no more than 15 minutes, a surprising number of artist studios, galleries, and spaces dedicated to the promotion of art and culture.

During the 1970's it established itself as the artistic hub of the capital. Today, after less fertile decades, painters, sculptors, collectives and galleries have started to turn back to the neighbourhood.

The Sa.L.A.D. - San Lorenzo Art District project was born to highlight this richness, unknown to many, and find the best way to tell it, promote it and support it.

We could define San Lorenzo as the mixed salad of art. That's where people, places, and activities (even those very different from each other) meet, mix, or solely coexist, giving life to a dimension of incredible artistic, cultural and social value.
